Receiving Your Photos:

How many photos do we get?

Weddings: How many photos received in the package depends on the weather, venue, ceremony time, family size, bridal party size, and the amount of wedding day coverage purchased. For a full day of coverage, I typically deliver anywhere from 400 to 1000 images.

Engagements, Family and other sessions: It typically takes around 2 hours of shooting to get a variety of photos, and you would receive anywhere between 25-40 photos.

Head Shots: Depending on what you are looking for in your session, we can shoot for 30 – 45 minutes, and you may receive around 10 head shots.

Who owns the rights to the photos?

As the photographer, I own the rights to the photos, to the extent that you may not sell the photos or claim them for your own portfolio purposes. With your permission, I would like to share any of your photos on my website and social media pages. You are given the printing rights within any package, and are able to print as many photos as you'd like! Feel free to create thank you cards, holiday cards, canvases or other prints for your own personal use. Due to storage limitations there is no guarantee that we will have copies of your photos, should they be lost. I always recommend personally backing up your photos once you receive them.

How long until we see our photos?

I will send a sneak peek 1 – 2 days after your wedding with about 20 – 30 photos. Depending on the workload and time of the year, you can expect the rest of your photos anywhere from 6 – 8 weeks after your wedding date. For engagements, family, head shots, and other sessions, you will typically receive your photos within 1 – 2 weeks.

Financing:

Is the deposit refundable?

No. There is a 25% deposit for weddings, which is required when you sign your contract. The reason being that the deposit is meant to reserve the photographer for the day of your wedding. Once the deposit is paid and you choose to cancel your booking, the deposit will be forfeited. The remaining balance will be due by the wedding date.

There is no deposit required for other sessions. Payment will be required on the day of your session.

How do you accept payment?

I can accept payment via check, Venmo, or PayPal.

What happens if it rains?

We will make the most of it! If you are comfortable in the rain, so am I. It's helpful to bring jackets, coats and umbrellas as to not limit the locations we are able to shoot. Umbrellas make particularly fun photo props! I do have a clear rounded umbrella that is great for photos! I always bring this with me just in case it's needed.

What can I do to help my photos reach their best potential?

Enjoy your day by smiling, relaxing and having fun! I believe it is important for you to feel comfortable with the photographer; that is why I encourage my couples to have the same photographer for both engagement and wedding photography. Venues with more natural lighting are also encouraged. Be creative! If you like, I can give you some fun prompts, or you can share ideas of your own as far as poses that you would like to include. Please share them with me! I like to interact with my clients during our sessions to give you the best possible experience and create some beautiful and natural photos.

Will Kayla be shooting my wedding?

Of course! Some of my packages do include second shooter, which can be very helpful for larger weddings. I especially recommend a second shooter if you are choosing not to do a First Look, so that together we may capture each of you during the ceremony.

Editing Style:

Can you make our photos look like this photographer/wedding?

Photographers all have their own signature style, which they work hard to create. You have chosen me based on what you've seen and enjoyed in my work. It is not possible, nor would I want it to be possible, to recreate another photographer's style. Again, you are welcome to share any ideas for poses that you would like with me. Feel free to show examples of poses you like that you may have found on Pinterest or Instagram. We can work on capturing something similar!

Do you share RAW files?

Most photographers do not share RAW files, and neither do I. Again, photographers all have their own style of photography and editing, and sharing RAW files allows the photos to be compromised. I am happy to edit black and white versions of photos for you, upon request. I kindly ask that you do not add filters yourself when you share your photos online. If you would like any changes to be made, please ask.
